James Loeb, 1867 – 1933

- Born 1867 as son of a Jewish-German banker in New York
- 1888 Harvard College
- 1888 1902 Kuhn, Loeb & Co, from 1894 as partner
- 1908 moves to Munich
- 1921 marries in Munich, moves to Murnau am Staffelsee, between Munich and the Alps
- 1933 dies in Murnau

1905 New York Institute of Musical Art, later Juilliard School of Music

1907 Annual Charles Elliot Norton Lecture

• In honor of his friend and teacher

1911 Donation of Arretine pottery to the Fogg Museum

1911 Loeb Classical Library

- Edition of bilingual (Greek/Latin and English) classical texts
- Since 1933 at Harvard University Press
- 500+ volumes and counting

MUNICH

1917 "Deutsche Forschungsanstalt für Psychiatrie," Prof. Kraeplin, later Max Planck-Institut für Psychiatrie


1930 Women's dormitory at Munich University

1933 "Sammlung James Loeb" at Staatliche Antikensammlungen

 About 800 objects, mostly small sculptures

MURNAU

1932 Donation of local hospital
