HARVARD PRIZE BOOK (Singapore)

24 *Prize Books awarded*

- The Harvard Prize Book (Singapore) award acknowledges and encourages altruism. It is intended to inspire students in Singapore with the idea that Harvard is an attainable institution of higher learning, and to connect students to the Harvard community in Singapore,
- Recipients are caring individuals who have, over a sustained period of time, gone beyond the call of duty to perform acts of kindness and caring, and who may have influenced their peers or family members to do likewise.
- Awarded to 24 students, each nominated by their own school.
- The award is a book about how students can make the most of college/university. Written by Harvard professor Richard Light, it is based on a decade of interviews with students.
