

#### Harvard's International Footprint




- More than 700 major research projects around the world 80 research centers – 21 field offices abroad
- Fact: Harvard hosts more international scholars than any other university in the US
- Enrollment: Total 22,434 students, International students: 5,245 (23.4%)
- Countries represented in Harvard College Class of 2021: 68

## Increase in Indian Student Enrollment at Harvard College




#### The Rest of the Picture: Student-Led Activities

- Harvard South Asian Association: 300+ members, 100+ annual events
  - Ghungroo: Largest student production
    at the university
- Conferences: Harvard College US-India Initiative and Harvard College in Asia Program
- Religious Groups: Harvard Dharma, Sikh Student Association
- Social Groups: South Asian Men's Collective, South Asian Women's Collective



#### **The Graduate School of Arts and Sciences**



- 4471 students 4,270 PhD and 201 Master's
  - 54% Sciences and Engineering
  - 28% Social Sciences
  - 18% Humanities
- International students make up 34% of the GSAS community, and represent 90 countries around the world.
- Top seven countries outside of the US: China, Canada, Republic of Korea, United Kingdom, Germany, India, Singapore

#### **Indian Students at GSAS**

- 857 applications received from Indian students in the 2017-18 admissions cycle, 31 students from India admitted
- 62 Indian students currently enrolled
  - 14 in Engineering & Applied Sciences
  - 5 in Medical Sciences
  - 21 spread across other sciences (10) and social sciences (11)
